



MAIZE USD 266 WINTER ACTIVITY SPECTATOR INFORMATION

Maize USD 266 parents and guardians,

During a Kansas State High Schools Activities Association (KSHSAA) Board of Directors meeting on Dec. 8, changes were made to spectator attendance guidance for school district events, effective through Jan. 28. We are writing today to inform you of how this new protocol affects winter activities for Maize USD 266 students, families, staff members, and visitors.

Beginning Thursday, Dec. 10, **up to two parents/guardians per participant's family** will be allowed to attend Maize USD 266 athletic events following the specifications described below.

Update for clarification: Please note that the two tickets for parents/guardians are **per participant's family**, not per participant as previously indicated. We apologize for any confusion this may have caused. In a case in which two or more siblings from the same family are participants for an event, only two tickets in total will be issued for the parents/guardians.

These procedures will apply to all two-team events. We are confident these changes are ones that can allow families to continue to support students, in terms of their athletic season, performance opportunities, health, and wellness. We appreciate the OneMaize community's ongoing support of our district, teams, programs, coaches, and students. According to KSHSAA, the impacted interscholastic activities include basketball, bowling, debate, forensics/speech, scholars bowl, swimming and diving, and wrestling.

Event Tickets and Passes:

1. Home and visiting participants will be allowed two tickets for their parents/guardians to use. The tickets must be used only by an adult parent or guardian of their child(ren). Tickets shall not be shared or redistributed in the event a parent/guardian is unable to attend. In the event there are multiple participants from one family, the total number of tickets distributed is two.
2. Parents/guardians may attend their child's game only and should arrive immediately before the contest and exit the facility once their child is done participating.
3. Those considered "participants" include: players, coaches, student managers, cheer squads, dance team members, pep band members, and student journalists.
4. When online ticket sales are available, information will be communicated to parents. When/if online tickets sales are unavailable, tickets will be distributed in an alternate manner to be communicated at the time.
5. Admission will continue to be \$6 per parent/guardian for high school events and \$4 per parent/guardian for middle school events. Each spectator's name must be on the approved list provided by the home and visiting schools. Children or siblings who are not participants are not allowed to attend. Identification may be required for entry.
6. No Booster Pass, AVCTL League Pass, Senior Activity Pass, or Pep Club Pass will be accepted.
7. Every person entering the facility must wear a face covering properly the entire time they are at the event. The face covering should be worn in the manner it is intended to be worn, covering the mouth and nose. The only exception is provided for athletes during the time they are competing and for officials during active play.
8. Parents/guardians from different households should social distance from each other at a minimum of six feet apart.
9. Only those employees scheduled to work events will have their names on the approved list and will be admitted for free.
10. Spectators are not allowed to bring food/drink into the playing venue(s).
11. Parents/guardians will not be allowed on the court/mat or by locker rooms.
12. Certain events, such as tournaments and invitationals, may be more restrictive to parent/guardian attendance.
13. Please adhere to the announcements made before and after competitions to help limit facility capacity.
14. All spectator guidelines are subject to change based on local conditions.

Please note that visiting participants will NOT be provided tickets to multi-team competitions that could include bowling, swimming and diving, and wrestling tournaments. As these events involve students competing against multiple school teams at the same time, visiting parents/guardians are not allowed at these events.

Live Stream and On-Demand Viewing Access

Fans will continue to have the ability to watch both live and on-demand streamed athletic events at no cost. Below, you will find additional information for each school. Please keep in mind this information only describes livestreaming opportunities when athletic events are at home. This does not guarantee that away games hosted by other schools will be livestreamed.
